

GRAFTON HALL OF RESIDENCE ACCOMMODATION SCHOLARSHIP



These scholarships have been established to assist selected students who would otherwise be precluded, or seriously inhibited, on financial grounds to live in a University of Auckland Hall of Residence.

The value and number of scholarships, known as Grafton Hall Accommodation Scholarships, will be determined annually.

Applicants must be New Zealand citizens and live in Grafton Hall of Residence.

Applications must be made on the appropriate forms provided, which are available from the Grafton Hall Office and should be returned no later than **Friday 26th March, 2010**.

A Grafton Hall Accommodation Scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship or bursary, provided that the rules of the other award allow it.

GRAFTON HALL OF RESIDENCE ACCOMMODATION SCHOLARSHIP



Grafton Hall Accommodation Scholarships have been established to assist selected students who may otherwise be precluded or seriously inhibited on financial grounds to continue to live in a University of Auckland Hall of Residence. The value and number of scholarships offered annually is dependent on profits generated from conference income.

Criteria:

1. The scholarship shall be known as the Grafton Hall Accommodation Scholarship.
2. The value and number of scholarships to be awarded will be determined annually.
3. Applicants must be New Zealand citizens.
4. Applicants must live in the hall for which they are making an application for a scholarship.
5. In considering applications, the Selection Committee will take into account financial hardship, academic progress, and likely further contribution to the hall.
6. A scholarship granted will be available to an applicant for a maximum of one year.
7. Payment of the scholarship shall be made by way of two equal instalments credited to the successful student's accommodation account at the time that the first payment of board fees falls due each semester.
8. The scholarship funds are administered by the Presbyterian Methodist Congregational Foundation Inc. and payments shall only be made directly to Grafton Hall to cover accommodation board fees.
9. The Presbyterian Methodist Congregational Foundation Inc. may vary the conditions of a scholarship from time to time, so long as there is no departure from the main purpose.
10. Applications for the scholarships should be received by the Grafton Hall Office no later than 5.00pm Friday 26th March, 2010.
11. No scholarships will be awarded if it is considered that there are no suitable applicants in any year.
12. If at any time the Presbyterian Methodist Congregational Foundation Inc. is not satisfied that the successful student is complying with the conditions of the scholarship, then the scholarship may be terminated.
13. The Grafton Hall Accommodation Scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship or bursary, provided that the rules of the other award allow it.

 - i. are New Zealand citizens;
 - ii. are in financial hardship.
